Message from the Head



Yet again we have had an incredibly busy half term, with students engaging in a wide variety of off site and on site learning experiences, sporting fixtures and for our older students mock exams.

The numbers of students in the schools has now topped 90 with an average over the financial year of 85. These are our highest levels to date.

This has inevitably put pressure on our resources and staffing. As a result we are looking to provide additional support in key areas of the school, as well as re-advertising vacancies as a matter of urgency where posts have not been filled to date. The school continues to work towards Academy conversion as consultation feedback raised no concerns.

Our target date to join The Manor Hall Academy Trust has, however, slipped as a result of circumstances beyond our control, and we are now looking at June 1st 2020 to convert. Thank you to those of you who were able to complete the parent survey. As you will be able to see from the summary, the outcome was very positive overall, with more parents and carers feeling better informed about their child's progress than in previous years.
