KEEP SAFE AT CHRISTMAS

With an increase in media coverage of 'County Lines' drug trafficking the school is working closely with West Midlands Police to raise awareness of this particularly nasty crime. As a result we would like to make you aware of what to look out for if you suspect your child may be vulnerable to, or could be involved in this practice especially over the up-coming holiday season:

- Returning home late, staying out all night or going missing
- Being found in areas away from home
- Being secretive about who they are talking to and where they are going
- Unexplained absences from school, college, training or work
- Unexplained money, phone(s), clothes or jewellery
- Increasingly disruptive or aggressive behaviour
- Coming home with injuries or looking particularly dishevelled
- Having hotel cards or keys to unknown places

Should you suspect anything please do not hesitate to notify the police on 101 and report your suspicions or worries immediately. Don't let your child be a victim!
