What the article failed to mention, was that the school has been working hard to address this situation over the last year.

Although the current financial year will continue to be challenging, the actions we have taken to date will ensure that the school is financially stable for years to come. As part of our 'recovery plan' the school intends to convert to an Academy in the new school year. In the Autumn term we will be consulting with parents, carers, staff and others who are involved in the school, to ensure that all views are taken into consideration before Governors make the final decision to convert.

Despite the issues we have faced I am pleased to say that it has been another successful year for the school with whole school attendance at an all time high and the number of sessions lost to exclusion across the sites at an all time low. We are also looking forward to receiving the exam results over the next few weeks.


NATIONAL AWARDS SUCCESS


School Data Box 2018/19
